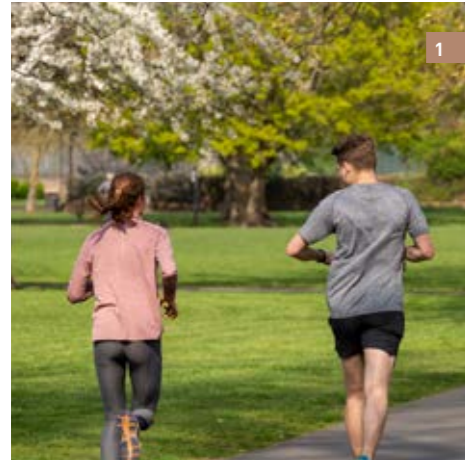


## POWER UP YOUR LIFESTYLE: SPACES & PLACES TO GO

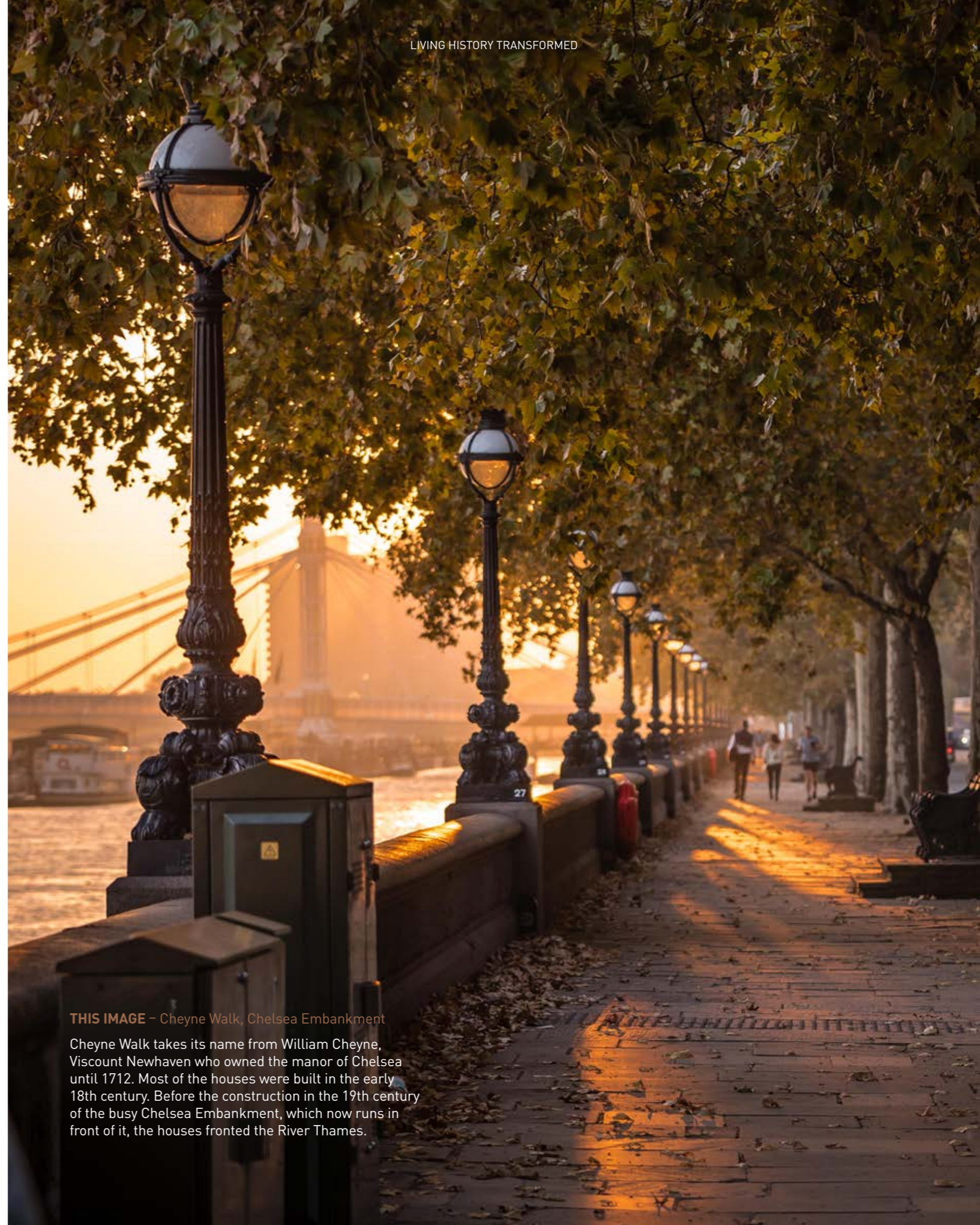

**THIS IMAGE** – Cheyne Walk, Chelsea Embankment

Cheyne Walk takes its name from William Cheyne, Viscount Newhaven who owned the manor of Chelsea until 1712. Most of the houses were built in the early 18th century. Before the construction in the 19th century of the busy Chelsea Embankment, which now runs in front of it, the houses fronted the River Thames.
